Two injured in crash at 12th and Spring

Two people were injured in a two-vehicle crash at 5:10 p.m. Wednesday at 12th and Spring. Megan S. Courtois, 38, of 2225 N. 12th, was injured and taken by ambulance to Blessing Hospital. No further information was available from the hospital.

The second person injured, Loretta K. Heinecke, 63, of LaPrairie, declined medical assistance.

Quincy police reported Robert P. Heinecke, 66, of LaPrairie, was driving a 2012 Ford Explorer east on Spring when he stopped at the stop sign at 12th and then began to cross the intersection between stopped vehicles backed up from the stoplight at 12th and Broadway. His vehicle collided with a northbound 2014 Toyota Corolla driven by Courtois.

Heinecke was ticketed on a charge of failure to stop at a stop intersection.

The crash occurred at 5:10 p.m. Wednesday.

5 arrests made during roadside check in Adams County

Troopers with District 20 of the Illinois State Police wrote 22 citations and made five arrests for alcohol or drugs during an Adams County

roadside safety check over Thanksgiving.

Troopers made no arrests for driving under the influence during the check Nov. 25 and 26.

Troopers issued 12 citations on occupant restraint violations, four tickets on driver's license offenses and one ticket on a registration offense. Four written warnings were issued.

The checks are designed to remove alcohol-impaired drivers from roads. Enforcement may also be taken on other violations during the check. The safety check was funded through the Illinois Department of Transportation's Division of Transportation Safety.

Special state police patrols net DUI arrests

Illinois State Police District 20 announced results from four special traffic enforcement programs held in Adams County in November.

Troopers made two arrests for driving under the influence and two arrests that were drug- or alcohol-related. Troopers wrote 67 speeding tickets and 25 tickets on occupant restraint violations. Troopers wrote 106 warnings, including 30 for suspected speeding.

The program is designed to raise awareness and compliance with traffic laws. A special emphasis was placed on speeding, failure to wear a seat belt, and DUI and other alcohol-related offenses. The project was funded through the Illinois Department of Transportation's Division of Traffic Safety.
